Job Summary

The Tribal Climate Resilience Specialist is responsible for performing activities related to San Diego Botanic Garden's culturally significant plant, climate resilience, and native plant research and restoration activities, particularly those conducted in collaboration with Tribal, Native, and Indigenous communities. This position will play a key role in the development and implementation of environmental restoration, gardening, native plant propagation, and other activities in collaboration with Jamul and Viejas Bands of Kumeyaay and Pala Band of Mission Indians in San Diego County, among others. The position requires significant travel to/from and work on these lands in San Diego County. This position also contributes to other botanical research and conservation activities within the Department of Science and Conservation, and is involved in maintaining and enhancing the plants, gardens, and grounds of SDBG and associated project sites.

- Experience with multi-cultural research or implementation projects and settings (required)
- Experience or knowledge of environmental restoration, gardening, and native plant propagation.
- Able to bend, squat, walk stairs, and hike on rugged trails (often off-trail) with uneven footing and in variable weather conditions (heat, rain, wind, sun exposure).

- Coordinates and helps to facilitate meetings with Tribal partners and supporting organizations on project activities.
- Conducts outreach and education related to Tribal partnership projects, both within and among
 Tribal communities as well as with the general public.
- Assists with the implementation of other tasks pertinent to Tribal partnership projects
- Assists with other SDBG activities and tasks as needed.
